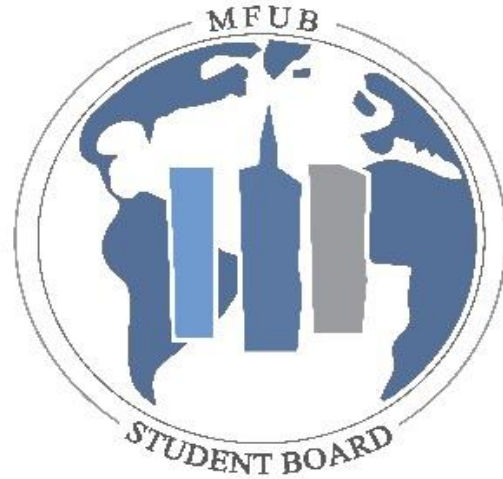


# Health insurance

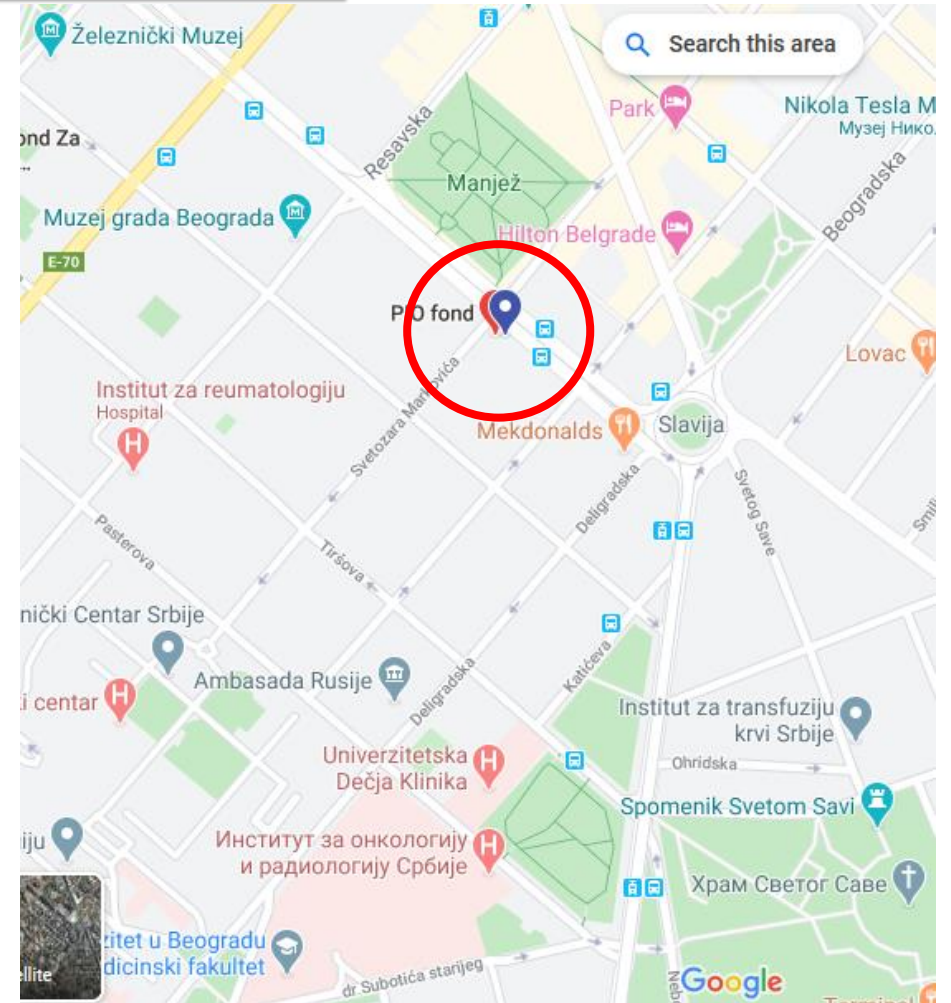


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# Institute for Public Health Insurance

- Where? Nemanijna str. 30 Belgrade First floor.
- Office 103 (there is a paper on the door) for diplomatic corp.
- Office 114 for foreigners.



## What is covering and clinics

- Health insurance covers hospital treatment, ambulatory treatment and physician services at Students Polyclinic (Krunska 57).
- Students polyclinic is the first line care, clinics in the clinical centre of Serbia are considered to be second line institutions so you need a paper from Students polyclinic in order to go to one of the clinics. But in practice, the ambulatory of clinics may accept you also without the paper from polyclinic.
- Public health in Serbia has to be considered satisfactory, you will spend some time in those clinics so you will know how they look like and even get to know the people who work there.

## For foreigners

- Foreigners can apply for health insurance at the previous mentioned institutes and office.
- They have already some experience with students but some situations may differ from others.
- Also some countries (Switzerland for example) have agreements with Serbia so that some public homeland health insurance may be automatically recognized in Serbia.
- Insurance for foreigner cost 2000 RSD per year.

## For half-Serbian students

- If one of your parents is Serbian and you both have Serbian citizenship (and documents) you can be registered as Serbian.
- In that case, our advice is to go to the same office, then they will direct you to the specific office.
- Pay attention, in order to be registered in this way, you need a copy of your Serbian parents' salary or the proof he is an employee in a foreign country.

## **For students with parents in the diplomatic corp**

- If the embassy didn't already provide you health insurance, you can refer to the previously mentioned office.
- On the first floor, close to the office for foreigners, there is the office for diplomats, a paper in the door indicates the place.

# Private insurance

- Depending on the individual, you can register for a private health insurance. In Serbia, there are some foreigners insurance companies (Societe General) as well as local (Dunav Osiguranje).
- If you have an international insurance, you should check IF and WHICH clinic is recognized from your insurance.
- Private health care system is well developed in Serbia, depending from your pocket, you can visit many private clinics.
- Being this a «school related presentation», the author didn't feel the need to go in details for private health care/insurance.



## Note

- You can find good doctors as well as bad doctors everywhere, in both public and private institutions.
- My best advice is to look for YOUR clinic, for the one where you will feel most comfortable and safe.
